 - A. The coming Kingdom was taught before Jesus came.
 - B. Jesus' Theology of the Kingdom.
 - C. The message of the Kingdom in the Church.
 1. Early evangelists carried the message of the Kingdom. Acts 8:12-13
 2. Paul evangelized with the message of the Kingdom. Acts 19:8
 3. Paul taught the Ephesian elders the message of the Kingdom. Acts 20:24-30
 4. Paul's final messages from prison concerned the Kingdom. Acts 28:23
 - D. The Church and the Kingdom.
 1. Christians are presently in His kingdom. Col 1:13-14
 2. His Kingdom is primarily concerned about spiritual things. Rom 14:16-18
 3. It focuses on application of Kingdom principles. 1 Cor 4:14-21
 4. Application of these principles affects our Spiritual Inheritance. Jas 2:5-6
 5. Eternal inheritance is for the new creation we are, not the old body. 1 Cor 15:50-51
 6. Failure to apply Kingdom principles costs eternal rewards. 1 Cor 6:9-11; Gal 5:19-22; Eph 5:5
 - E. The theology establishes the foundation for kingdom living in the Church Age.
 1. Work together with other Christians. Col 4:10-11
 2. Walk worthy of the One who invited us. 1 Thes 2:10-12
 3. Act worthy of the Kingdom. 2 Thes 1:3-5
 4. Proclaim the truth about it. 2 Tim 4:1-5
 5. Preach divine assurance. 2 Tim 4:18
 6. Grow spiritually and produce fruit in appreciation for it. 2 Pet 1:8-11
